
ART BRINGS US TOGETHER

STATEMENT OF FINANCIAL ACTIVITIES FOR MERCER ISLAND CENTER FOR THE ARTS

Life-to-Date as of 12.31.15

Over the first two years of MICA's existence, a majority of our disbursements have related to the study, planning, and design of the arts facility with emphases on the resident artists and long term operational sustainability. These expenditures were in line with our overall \$25 million project budget. Disbursements were covered by early donations leaving a comfortable level of liquidity for the organization as we enter 2016. MICA has raised over \$5 million in cash and pledges – more than enough to fund preconstruction expenses.


Contributed income for unrestricted operating activity came from individual donors, corporate matching gifts and in-kind support. A relatively small amount of our pledges are restricted – contingent upon MICA securing a lease or other milestones.

Creating urgency for the 2016 capital campaign is the increasing costs of construction in the Seattle area, which has been increasing at ~4% per annum.

MEET MICA'S RESIDENT USERS

YOUTH THEATRE NORTHWEST nurtures the intellectual, artistic and personal development of children and youth through drama, education, performing opportunities and live theatre experience. Founded in 1984, YTN has served tens of thousands of children and provided high-quality performances for hundreds of thousands of audience members. For many young students and audience members, YTN is their first exposure to the performing arts. Both a theatre and a school, YTN provides a wide range of dynamic classes and programs serving up to 2,000 children (ages 3-18) per year.

CHILDREN'S DANCE CONSERVATORY/ISLAND YOUTH BALLET provides the best classical ballet training possible. Annual performances offer students the opportunity to have pleasurable and inspiring experiences that only the stage experience can offer. Classical ballet is a precise physical art. Today's training reflects an even greater use of the knowledge gathered from the exercise sciences such as kinesiology, biomechanics and proprioceptive awareness to provide the highest possible teaching and training standards.

MUSICAL MIND STUDIO offers a warm and creative environment with encouragement and training, helping all ages become thinking musicians who enjoy music for life. The studio specializes in working with children with Autism, ADD, ADHD, and other conditions using a creative approach of teaching that works best for the child. Musical Mind believes that music is a joy and music lessons should be fun.

MUSIC WORKS NORTHWEST is dedicated to providing accessible music education and experiences, regardless of financial means. Since 1966, Music Works has served thousands of students with music instruction, free concerts, and a vibrant music therapy program. Last year over 3,000 people attended free concerts at Music Works, and hundreds of public school music students participated in free music classes at their schools, provided by Music Works.

RUSSIAN CHAMBER MUSIC FOUNDATION brings the best of Russian classical music to American audiences. RCMF presents concerts and recitals by major international artists and sponsors festivals and competitions for children and young adults. Outreach programs in schools increases the diversity in their music programs. RCMF has also partnered with the prestigious Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center in New York among others.

MERCER ISLAND VISUAL ARTS LEAGUE (MIVAL) has been involved for more than 50 years creating community through the visual arts. MIVAL welcomes all artists, all mediums, and all levels of interest. Monthly meetings with guest speakers are held each month. Special art shows such as Summer Celebration, Junior Art Show, and the Holiday Show as well as MIVAL Gallery, support all artists and their endeavors.

AND THE BEST OF THE NORTHWEST

Strategically located between Seattle and the Eastside, MICA has generated a lot of enthusiasm among some of the finest arts organizations in the region. Groups that have expressed interest in performing at MICA include ACT Theater, The Seattle Shakespeare Company, Book-It Repertory Theater, Seattle Symphony, Teatro ZinZanni, Pacific Musicworks, Byron Schenkman & Friends, and many others. MICA will bring the best of the arts to Mercer Island.

ECONOMIC IMPACT

According to ArtsFund, the activity of nonprofit cultural organizations and their patrons in King, Kitsap, Pierce and Snohomish Counties generated \$2.4 billion in the Washington State economy and created 35,376 jobs, \$996 million in labor income and \$105 million in taxes. Locally, Edmonds, Kirkland, Bainbridge Island, and especially Issaquah have experienced major positive economic impact on their town centers as a result of new cultural facilities. Mercer Island's town center is ripe for the focus, energy, and economic revitalization that MICA is poised to bring.

LOCATION

In 2013, a City task force determined that the best location for an Arts Center was the city-owned land adjacent to the northwest corner of Mercerdale Park on the site of the abandoned recycling center and surrounding area. MICA will not interfere with any current park activities and will remain outside the walking path. MICA will provide facility support for the Farmers Market, Summer Celebration, the Mostly Music in the Park series, and other community events.



THE FACILITY

MICA's plan and scope was developed in close consultation with its users to include a three-theater complex for the presentation of plays, musicals, dance, concerts, recitals, lectures, films, and visual art. The plans are for a 300-seat Main Stage, 100-seat Recital Studio, 100-seat Theater Lab, classrooms, studios, meetings, office space and community gathering space.

The facility will be owned and operated by the non-profit organization Mercer Island Center for the Arts. The land will continue to be owned by the City of Mercer Island and leased to MICA for the purpose of presenting arts and cultural events and activities for the community. MICA will oversee all use and upkeep of the facility and coordinating space/event scheduling. Currently estimated construction costs are \$18-20 million and overall campaign costs around \$25 million. The proposed lease with the City lists specific benefits MICA will provide to the City and the public, and requires MICA to pay all operating costs. The City must approve MICA's design, parking plan, operating plan and budget, and issue building permits, and MICA must have financial commitments to cover all of the construction costs and a construction performance bond before construction begins.

The facility design is led by some of the region's pre-eminent architects / urban designers. Lesley Bain, FAIA, LEED AP, (Theatre Commons, Seattle Center, Seattle Rep Additions) is a nationally recognized member of the AIA's College of Fellows, and is a native and current resident of Mercer Island. Owen Richards, AIA, LEED AP, (McCaw Hall, Chihuly Garden and Glass) brings design experience of more than 20 performing arts and cultural facilities. Adam Shalleck, AIA, Theater Designer, will lead systems planning and design for all the technical areas. Michael Yantis, Acoustical Engineer and Design, P.E. will provide full acoustical engineering services. OLIN, landscape architects, (Bryant Park, Getty Museum) will bring beautiful and environmentally sensitive landscaping to MICA.

A SUSTAINABLE OPERATIONAL MODEL

MICA's operating projections were built from the bottom up by the global arts and entertainment expert, AMS Planning and Research, in consultation with MICA resident users. Multiple venues and resident users diversify the revenue streams and arts education provides a major portion of the revenue model. The pro forma uses the industry best practices, conservative estimates, and annual contributed income well within the expected range for a community arts venue.
